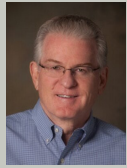

"My house shall
be a house of
prayer"

"We tend to use prayer as a last resort, but God wants it to be our first line of defense. We pray when there's nothing else we can do, but God wants us to pray before we do anything at all. — Oswald Chambers

This week at the State Evangelism Conference we were reminded by Jim Cymbala that God's house is to be a **house of prayer** (Matthew 21:13) and that Paul told Timothy to **"first of all pray"** (1 Timothy 2:1). Furthermore we are admonished to **pray at all times** (Ephesians 6:18). Yet we have almost reduced prayer to token gestures and programmed events.

May we take Cymbala's message to heart. The church is open throughout the week for fellowships, basketball practices, community events and more...plus the regular weekly church work that goes on. Why can't it be open for prayer, too? You are welcome to come pray anytime you wish. Bring your personal needs to God...prayerwalk your classroom...pray "on site" for the Sunday service...pray for the lost who will sit in those seats.

One other thing, when the offices are staffed during the days, we would gladly make the pastor's study available so that you can come pray for the pastor search team and for the man that will occupy that office when God moves. We must become intentional in our prayer life and then remain persistent in prayer until God moves according to His sovereign will. Oswald Chambers concluded his above statement on prayer as follows:

Most of us would prefer, however, to spend our time doing something that will get immediate results. We don't want to wait for God to resolve matters in His good time because His idea of 'good time' is seldom in sync with ours." — Oswald Chambers
