WHY CHURCH PLANTING?

The vigorous, continual planting of new congregations is the single most crucial strategy for

- 1) the numerical growth of the body of Christ in any city,
- 2) the continual corporate renewal and revival of the existing churches in a city.

So, why is church planting so crucially important?

1. We want to be true to the biblical mandate.

Virtually all the great evangelistic challenges of the New Testament are basically calls to plant churches, not simply to share the faith. Leading missiologist C. Peter Wagner said, "Planting new churches is the most effective evangelistic methodology known under heaven."

We see that Paul's whole strategy was to plant churches. He went into the largest city of the region (cf. Acts 16:9,12), and second, he planted churches in each city (cf. Titus 1:5).

2. We want to be true to the Great Commission.

Dozens of studies have confirmed that the average new church gains most of its new members (60-80%) from the ranks of people who are not attending any worshipping body, while churches over 10-15 years of age gain 80-90% of new members by transfer from other congregations.

3. New churches challenge other churches to selfexamination.

The "success" of new churches often challenges older congregations in general to evaluate themselves in substantial ways. Sometimes it is only in contrast with a new church that older churches can finally define their own vision, specialties, and identity.

4. As an exercise in Kingdom-mindedness.

Our attitude to new church development is a test of whether our mindset is geared to our own institutional turf, or to the overall health and prosperity of the kingdom of God in the city.

Summary

New church planting is the only way that we can be sure we are going to increase the number of believers in a city and one of the best ways to renew the whole body of Christ. In the end, a lack of kingdom-mindedness may simply blind us to all this evidence. We must beware of that.
