- CONFESSION: Spend time confessing sin and all that hinders your relationship with God.
- READ THE WORD: Spend time reading the word of God.
- •PETITION: Spend time praying general prayers of blessing and protection for yourself, family & others.
- •INTERCEDE: Spend time praying specifically for one or two people or issues.
- PRAY THE WORD: Go back to the scripture you read. Read a verse and then pray the essence of that verse back to God.
- •THANKSGIVING: Spend time thanking God for all of His blessings and actions in your life.
- •SINGING: Spend time singing a favorite hymn or play a worship song on youtube.
- •MEDITATE: Spend time meditating on one aspect of God, a phrase of scripture.
- •LISTEN: Spend time listening to what the Holy Spirit might be wanting to say to you through this time. Have a notebook and pen handy to write down anything you hear from God.
- PRAISE: End your time praising God.

A TRIP TO ABILENE

"Relative truth." That's a phrase like "somewhat genuine" or "50% sterile" or "sort of dead." Webster says "relative" denotes something in proportion to a standard; and when it comes to truth, there is only one standard... John 17:17 - ...thy word is truth.

Psalm 119:160 - The sum of your word is truth, and every one of your righteous rules endures forever.

Like the proverbial "frog in the kettle," we have gradually succumbed to the allure of "relative truth" (i.e. falsehood) by listening to the myriad of voices spouting their opinions and seeking to maintain the peace by being passively agreeable rather than truthful. In a 1974 business article, management expert Jerry Harvey wrote the following illustration which gave birth to the agreement management principle "The Abilene Paradox."

On a hot afternoon visiting in Coleman, Texas, the family is comfortably playing dominoes on a porch, until the father-in-law suggests that they take a [50-mile] trip to Abilene for dinner. The wife says, "Sounds like a great idea." The husband, despite having reservations because the drive is long and hot, thinks that his preferences must be out-of-step with the group and says, "Sounds good to me. I just hope your mother wants to go." The mother-in-law then says, "Of course I want to go. I haven't been to Abilene in a long time."

The drive is hot, dusty, and long. When they arrive at the cafeteria, the food is as bad as the drive. They arrive back home four hours later, exhausted.

One of them dishonestly says, "It was a great trip, wasn't it?" The mother-in-law says that, actually, she would rather have stayed home, but went along since the other three were so enthusiastic. The husband says, "I wasn't delighted to be doing what we were doing. I only went to satisfy the rest of you." The wife says, "I just went along to keep you happy. I would have had to be crazy to want to go out in the heat like that." The father-in-law then says that he only suggested it because he thought the others might be bored.

The group then sits back, perplexed that they together decided to take a trip that none of them wanted.

Truth lights the pathway to God.

"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path. Who shall dwell on your holy hill? He who walks blamelessly and does what is right and speaks truth in his heart; Psalm 119:105; 15:1-2 *Relative truth* is just a bad trip to Abilene.
