What is the Septuagint?

In *Hebrews 1:4-14*, the writer quotes 7 Old Testament passages. The language that he is writing in, like the rest of the New Testament, is in Greek. He quotes the Old Testament which was mostly written in Hebrew (though there are parts that are in Aramaic, the language of the Babylonian Empire). The Greek Translation of the Hebrew Old Testament is called the Septuagint.

The Septuagint (also known as the LXX- Roman Numeral for 70) is a translation of the Hebrew Bible into the Greek language. The name Septuagint comes from the Latin word for "seventy." The tradition is that 70 (or 72) Jewish scholars were the translators behind the Septuagint. The Septuagint was translated in the third and second centuries BC in Alexandria, Egypt (traditionally dated to the reign of Ptolemy II Philadelphus of Egypt (285-246 BC). As Israel was under the authority of Greece for several centuries, the Greek language became more and more common. By the second and first centuries BC, most people in Israel spoke what is known as Koine (Common) Greek as their primary language. That is why the effort was made to translate the Hebrew Bible into Greek—so that those who did not understand Hebrew could have the Scriptures in a language they could understand. The Septuagint represents the first major effort at translating a significant religious text from one language into another.

As faithful as the Septuagint translators strove to be in accurately rendering the Hebrew text into Greek, some translational differences arose. But the fact that the apostles and New Testament authors felt comfortable, under the direction of the Holy Spirit, in using the Septuagint should give us assurance that a translation of the original languages of the Bible is still the authoritative Word of God. 

KNIT TOGETHER, WONDERFULLY!

If you grew up with black and white movies you might know the name Johnny Weissmuller...a 5-time Olympic gold medalist swimmer who became the best known of the early actors who played Tarzan. He immortalized the line, "Me Tarzan, you Jane." You may not be familiar with the name Johnny Sheffield, but if you know Tarzan, you probably also know Sheffield's character. For 8 years, Sheffield played Tarzan's adopted son, "Boy." Now, when we're born, the "gender reveal" is a big part of the celebration. But if 8 years later, your parents still identify you simply as "Boy," you might be wrestling with some real identity issues.

For you formed my inward parts; you knitted me together in my mother's womb.

I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; my soul knows it very well. Psalm 139:13-14 (ESV)

On Sunday, Bro. Drew mentioned that our Advance Youth Ministry is beginning a focus on "identity in Christ." Certainly, there is a big and important emphasis today on the gender identity issue and one we need to get a Biblical perspective on. We're offering some big help on that on April 21st (check out the ad in today's newsletter). But there is so much more to our identity in Christ than just male or female. Look at the last 6 words of the verse above; "my <u>soul</u> knows it very well." This tells me the aforementioned "inward parts" are more than just bone and muscle. God's divine knitting was physical, mental and spiritual. That's why Jesus said the greatest commandment is equally all-inclusive.

Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. Mark 12:30 (HCSB)

Truly finding our identity in Christ certainly involves a clear understanding of His purpose in creating male and female; but it is also in learning how He uniquely knitted together my total being. To my soul He gave salvation and spiritual giftedness; to my body He gave physical abilities. To my mind He gave the ability to reason how to perfect and use those gifts and to my heart He gave a passion to serve Him. Finding your identity in Christ means understanding how fearfully and wonderfully you have been knit together and how the greatest facet of your being is an eternal soul that was formed in His image and, thus, only happy and complete in Him.

This understanding of identity is not the result or a sermon series or a book study. Rather, it's a lifetime of discovery; the byproduct of discipleship.




Our Equip The Home will look a little different for April. Sunday, April 21, Ricky Chelette with Living Hope Ministries will be with us at our 8:00am &


